This may include specialist autism services. Differential diagnosis and co-occurring conditions; prevalence; trajectory; outcome 	Trainer should be able to demonstrate and provide evidence of the following: - that the training course been coproduced with the autistic community - experience/background in delivering training - can the trainer evidence the necessary level of knowledge/skill to deliver this level of training? - demonstrates appropriate level of qualifications - key learning outcomes of the course delivery, match the learning objectives at this level
